From Your Congregation President

Welcome to October 2023 and my favorite months of the year ... summer heat changes to cool, well into the college football season, Octoberfest, Halloween/All Saints Day, Thanksgiving, Advent, Christmas, New Years and my new favorite, Mardi Gras.

Summer was quiet, September less so. We ordered the new sign for the front of the church and we expect it to be complete in time for Lutherfest at the end of October. Dinner groups started and we are well underway with our listening sessions and improvement made to the coffee area. Sunday school has begun and Outreach has been active with Prodisee Pantry, snacks for children at W.J. Carroll Intermediate School here in Daphne and planning has started for our annual Halloween festivities. Andy Veren has been active in maintaining our constitution and operating by-laws and the Nominating Committee is back in action.

As a congregation, we are meeting our financial obligations but giving has been a bit soft in the summer months. This is normal and would not be a huge issue, but we have had a bit of a tussle with the city on our drainage pond in the front of the church. First, shout out to Daryl Bogle for going above and beyond in seeing the need to improve the area to save our parking lot. Where the challenge came is when a torrential rain hit for a couple of weeks and then 2 months of drought. This left us with sandy soil in the pond area, unsuitable for sodding. A neighbor or concerned citizen then complained to the city Daphne and the EPA saying we are impacting the Hiawassee Watershed.

Joe Taylor, who assisted in the design of the original pond, has volunteered his time to help us. The city had been insisting we sod the area even though the likelihood of success was extremely low. Joe and Daryl found the standard in this situation is hydroseed and found the ALDOT/City mix that is the current standard. Lynn Russell then jumped in to meet the city coordinator and got them to, begrudgingly, accept the plan with the threat that they will be back if they don't like the results. Sod would have cost \$15,000 and Daryl was able to negotiate an amazing deal for hydroseeding of \$3,500. We had 10 days to submit the plan and 30 days to do the work or "there will be penalties". Lynn also agreed to be the Property Council Member in 2024 as a bonus. We really don't have the \$3,500 but we are stretching resources to cover and hope we can recover some in Fall. (If you feel it in your heart to help out here, it will be most appreciated!) It sort of reminded me of an episode of the "A Team" where it gets messy before it gets better. I love it when a plan comes together.

"*Embrace, Enhance and Expand*?' is the theme of our fall Stewardship Appeal expanding our theme from the 2023 campaign: **Embrace o**ur church home, **Enhance o**ur church services and **Expand o**ur educational and small group opportunities! We are looking for a modest increase in giving and have moved our special appeal for the first quarter of 2024. Our new focus will be to improve our financial reserves in 2024 so we are better prepared for future emergencies.

Donating Altar Flowers: Please keep in mind that your normal offering contributions do not pay for altar flowers. If you would like to donate a particular Sunday's flowers, the cost is \$35.00. Simply use the sign-up sheet on the corkboard located in the narthex, and as the Sunday approaches place your donation in the offering plate. Make checks payable to Holy Trinity, noting *"Altar Flowers"* on the check. Please note there are no flowers at the altar during Lent.

Current vs. Building Fund Reminder: Specify how you want your offering split between the Current Fund and the Building Fund. If you do not specify on your envelope, it will by default go to the Current Fund. Anonymous cash (without an envelope specification) will all go towards the Current Fund. Checks without an envelope or notation on the check will by default go 100% towards the Current Fund. If you wonder about the percentage split that best services both funds, try directing 65% towards the Current Fund and 35% towards the Building Fund. Ongoing mission activities and Synod/ELCA funding is sourced from the Current Fund.
