SUNDAYS AFTER PENTECOST September – 2023

"Rejoice in hope, be patient in suffering, persevere in prayer." Romans 12:12

(From the Second Lesson appointed for Pentecost XIV)

Dear friends,

- We have some new services planned to include Healing and Coffeeshop Services. With Joy moving on, we have started the process of recruiting a new keyboard/piano player for our services.

We are in Phase 1 of the Fall stewardship program and expect to have Appeal Sunday on 11/5 and Celebration Sunday on 11/12. We are planning to move the Special Appeal into early 2024. We can still use some additional Stewardship Team members for this year's event.

The Nominating Committee will soon be let loose to help us recruit council members for next year. Please be open to volunteering. One position, in particular, is important next year, Vice President. The new structure for the President role is one year as VP and one year as President. I have one more year to go and then need someone to take over. The VP position is perfect to learn the role before you have jump in.

We also still need to fill the Property Council role now. You do not need to be a handyman as this role focuses on what needs to be done and we then work together on the how.

Donating Altar Flowers: Please keep in mind that your normal offering contributions do not pay for altar flowers. If you would like to donate a particular Sunday's flowers, the cost is \$35.00. Simply use the sign-up sheet on the corkboard located in the narthex, and as the Sunday approaches place your donation in the offering plate. Make checks payable to Holy Trinity, noting *"Altar Flowers"* on the check. Please note there are no flowers at the altar during Lent.

Current vs. Building Fund Reminder: Specify how you want your offering split between the Current Fund and the Building Fund. If you do not specify on your envelope, it will by default go to the Current Fund. Anonymous cash (without an envelope specification) will all go towards the Current Fund. Checks without an envelope or notation on the check will by default go 100% towards the Current Fund. If you wonder about the percentage split that best services both funds, try directing 65% towards the Current Fund and 35% towards the Building Fund. Ongoing mission activities and Synod/ELCA funding is sourced from the Current Fund.
